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1. Getting started

Location

Important

Do not place your C42 in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Place your C42 corded base within reach of the mains power and telephone wall socket so that the cables will reach. The socket-outlet shall be installed near the equipment and shall be easily accessible.

Make sure that it is at least 1 metre away from other electrical appliances to avoid interference. Your C42 works by sending radio signals between the cordless handset and telephone base. The strength of the signal depends on where you place the base. Placing it as high as possible ensures the best signal.

Cordless handset range

The unit has a range of up to 300 metres outdoors when there is a clear line of sight between the telephone base and the cordless handset. Any obstruction between the base and handset will reduce the range significantly. With the base indoors and the handset either indoors or outdoors, the range will normally be up to 50 metres. Thick concrete and stone walls can severely affect the range.

Signal strength

The **III** icon on your handset indicates that you are within range of the base. When out of range of the base, the **III** icon flashes. If you are on a call, you will hear a warning beep.


The line will hang up if the handset moves out of range of the base. Move closer to the base. The handset will automatically reconnect to the base.

Setting up

Important


The base station must be plugged into the mains power at all times. Do not connect the telephone line cord into the wall socket until the handset is fully charged. Use only the power adaptor and telephone line cord supplied with the product.

Connecting the corded base and handset



- 1. Plug the telephone line cord into the socket marked 🛓 on the rear of the base.
- 2. Plug the power adaptor into the socket marked 1 on the rear of the base and plug the other end into the mains power wall socket. Switch on the mains power.
- 3. Plug the curly cord into the corded handset and the telephone base.

Connecting the charger and charging the cordless handset



- 1. Plug the power adaptor into the socket marked $\frac{1}{2}$ on the underside of the charger and plug the other end into the mains power wall socket.
- Remove the battery cover from the back of the handset and insert the 2 x AAA NiMH rechargeable batteries supplied. Please note the '+' and '-' markings inside the battery compartment and insert in the correct direction.



- 3. Slide the battery cover back into place.
- 4. If you are charging the batteries for the first time, place the handset on the charger to charge for at least 16 hours continuously.
- The display will show the handset name and number to indicate that it is registered to the base.

Important

Warning! Use only the approved rechargeable Ni-MH battery cells (2 x AAA Ni-MH 550mAh rechargeable batteries) supplied with your C42.

Battery low warning

If you hear a warning beep every 2 minutes during a call, you will need to recharge the handset before you can use it again.

Battery performance

In ideal conditions, fully charged batteries should give up to 16 hours talk time or up to 200 hours standby time on a single charge.¹

Note that new batteries do not reach their full capacity until they have been put to normal use for several days.

To keep your batteries in the best condition, leave the handset off the charger for a few hours at a time.

Running the batteries right down at least once a week will help them last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of rechargeable batteries will reduce with time as they wear out, giving the handset less talk / standby time. Eventually they will need to be replaced.

After charging your handset for the first time, subsequent charging time is about 6-8 hours a day. Batteries and handset may become warm during charging. This is normal.

Important

When fully charged batteries are removed and re-inserted, or the handset is powered off and on, the battery icon on the display will reduce to 1 bar. The battery is still fully charged and the handset can be used as normal. If you charge the handset again by replacing it on the base unit, it will usually show fully charged after 10 minutes (this time will be dependent on the battery capacity). This is normal behaviour and is a reminder to charge the handset to prevents calls being dropped.

¹All talk and standby times are approximate and depend on features selected and usage pattern.

Welcome

- 1. The Welcome screen will briefly appear on the cordless handset display, then a list of countries is displayed.
- 2. Scroll $\stackrel{>}{P}$ or $\stackrel{>}{\P}$ to your country (operator) and press $\stackrel{\boxtimes}{\boxtimes}$.
- 3. Using the keypad set the date using the format DD/MM/YYYY and press 🖾 .
- 4. Using the keypad set the time in 24 hour format and press 2.
- 5. The standby screen is then displayed and your phone is ready to use.

Date and time

If you have subscribed to a Caller ID service, the date and time is set automatically when you receive your first call.

If you do not have Caller ID service, you can set the date and time manually.

From the cordless handset

- 1. Press , the display shows **Phonebook**.
- 2. Scroll 1 to **Phone setup** and press 1.
- Scroll [●] to Date & time. Press [●].
- Using the keypad enter the date (e.g. 04-12-2019 for 4th of December 2019) and press w/ to confirm.
- 5. Enter the time in 24 hour format (e.g. 18-30 for 6:30pm) and press

- 2. Press (MENU/OK), scroll ▼ to DATE & TIME and press (MENU/OK)







3. Using the phone

3.1 Calls

3.1.1 Make a call

1. Lift the handset and dial the number.

3.1.2 Preparatory dialling

- 1. Dial the number first. If you make a mistake press to delete the last digit.
- 2. Lift the handset to dial.

3.1.3 End a call

1. Place the corded handset back on the telephone base.

3.1.4 Receive a call

When you receive a call, the base rings and $\,$ flashes on the display.

1. Simply lift the corded handset to answer the call.

3.2 Adjust the earpiece volume

1. During a call, press \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to increase or decrease the volume. There are 5 levels to choose from.

3.3 Mute

You can mute your base so that you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing.

- During a call, press The display shows MUTE ON and your caller cannot hear you.
- 2. Press 💽 again to resume your call.

3.4 Intercom

3.4.1 Make an internal call

You can make internal calls between the base and handset.

- 1. Press and hold $\mathbf{*}_{int}$ on the base.
- 2. If only one handset is registered to the base that handset will ring.
- If more than one handset is registered to the base scroll ▼ to the required handset and press (MENUCY)

3.4.2 Receive an internal call

1. Lift the handset to answer the call.

Note

If during an internal call you receive an incoming call, you will hear the alert tone on the base. Replace the handset and pick up again to answer the call and end the internal call.

3.4.3 Transfer a call

- 1. Press and hold $\mathbf{*}_{int}$ on the base.
- 2. If only one handset is registered to the base that handset will ring.
- 3. If more than one handset is registered to the base scroll ▼ to the required handset and press [MENUACK]
- 4. When the internal call is answered, place the corded handset on the corded base to complete the transfer.

Note

Your external call resumes automatically after 60 seconds if there is no answer.

3.4.4 3-way conference call

You can hold a 3-way conference call between 2 internal callers and 1 external caller.

During a call with an external caller:

- 1. Press and hold $\mathbf{*}_{int}$ on the base.
- 2. If only one handset is registered to the base that handset will ring.
- 3. If more than one handset is registered to the base scroll ▼ to the required handset and press weread.
- 4. When the handset answers, press to connect all three callers and begin the conference call.
- 5. Place the corded handset back on the corded base and press e on the cordless handset to end the call.

Note

If there is no answer on the cordless handset your external call resumes automatically after 60 seconds.

3.5 Hands-free speakerphone

Hands-free lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to the conversation over the loudspeaker.

3.5.1 Make a hands-free call

1. Dial the number and then press 🔄 🖬 is displayed and you will hear the call over the base loudspeaker.

Note

During a hands-free call, press \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to adjust the volume. There are 5 levels to choose from.

3.5.2 Answer a call hands-free

1. Press 🔄 🔹 to answer the call in hands-free mode.

3.5.3 Switch between earpiece and hands-free during a call

3.6 Redial

The last 10 entries dialled are stored in the redial list.

3.6.1 View or dial an entry

- 1. Press 🔊 to open the Redial list.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want.
- Either lift the corded handset or press to automatically dial the selected number.

3.6.2 Copy a Redial list number to the phonebook

- 1. Press $\fbox{ (a) }$ to open the Redial list.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want.
- 3. Press the display shows **SAVE NUMBER**.
- 4. Press the display shows ENTER NAME.
- Enter the name using the keypad, if you make a mistake press a character or digit.
- 6. Press edit the number if necessary.
- 7. Press MENU/OK, the entry is saved.

Note

See "Entering names" and "Writing tips" on page 23.

3.6.3 Delete an entry

- 1. Press 🐚 to open the Redial list.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want.
- 3. Press we interpret if the phone number is stored in the phonebook the display shows **DELETE**, if not scroll ▼ to **DELETE**.
- 4. Press the display shows **CONFIRM**?.
- 5. Press to confirm.

3.6.4 Delete the entire Redial list

- 1. Press 🐚 to open the Redial list.
- 2. Press MENUJOK, scroll ▼ to DELETE ALL.
- 3. Press the display shows **CONFIRM**?.
- 4. Press to confirm.

4. Phonebook

You can store up to 50 names and numbers in the corded base. Names can be up to 14 characters long and numbers up to 24 digits. The base and handset share the phonebook.

4.1 Store a number

- 5. Press , the display shows **PHONEBOOK**.
- 6. Press MENU/OK, scroll ▼ to ADD NEW.
- 7. Press the display shows ENTER NAME.
- Enter the name using the keypad, if you make a mistake press to delete a character.
- 9. Press (MENU/OK), the display shows ENTER NUMBER.
- 10. Enter the number using the keypad, if you make a mistake press delete a digit.
- 11. Press MENU/OK, the entry is saved.

Entering names

Use the keypad letters to enter names, e.g. to store TOM:

If you have subscribed to Caller ID Service, the date and time will be set on your base whenever a call is received. You can also manually set the date and time.

- Press MENU/CK, scroll ▼ to PHONE SETUP.
- Press ______, scroll ▼ to DATE & TIME and press ______
- Using the keypad enter the date (e.g. 04-12-2019 for 4th of December 2019) and press measurement to confirm.
- 4. Enter the time in 24 hour format (e.g. 18-30 for 6:30pm) and press to confirm.

Note

Only the last two digits of the year are ajustable.

5.3 Language

- 1. Press (MENU/OK), scroll ▼ to PHONE SETUP and press (MENU/OK).
- 2. Scroll ▼ to LANGUAGE and press
- 3. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to the language you want and press to confirm.

6. Services

6.1 Calls list type

You can set the Call list to show All calls or Missed calls only. If All calls is selected, press *r* key in idle and you can view all calls lists. If Missed calls is selected, press *r* key in idle and you can view missed call only.

- 1. Press _____, scroll ▼ to SERVICES and press _____
- 2. The display shows CALL LIST TYPE, press
- 3. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to the call list you require, **ALL CALLS** or **MISSED CALLS**.
- 1. Press to confirm.

6.2 Conference

When the feature is set to Auto, if handset 1 is on line with an external caller, handset 2 can seize the line and immediately join the call with handset 1 and the external caller.

- 1. Press MENU/OK, scroll ▼ to SERVICES and press
- 2. Scroll ▼ to **CONFERENCE** and press MENU/OK
- 3. Scroll \blacktriangle or \triangledown to OFF or AUTO and press to confirm.

6.3 Auto prefix

This feature checks and formats a pre-dialled outgoing number before it is dialled out.

Set detect digit and prefix number

You can set a detect number that can be up to 10 digits, once this number has been set the phone will check the first few digits of the any pre-dialled number and if they match the detect number will be replaced them with the prefix number.

You can also define a prefix number (maximum of 10 digits) to be added to the beginning of any pre-dialled number.

- Press MENUOX scroll ▼ to SERVICES and press MENUOX
 Scroll ▼ to AUTO PREFIX and press MENUOX
 The display shows DETECT DIGIT press MENUOX
 Using the keypad enter the number and press MENUOX To delete the current number press •.
 Press MENUOX the display shows PREFIX.
 Using the keypad enter the number and press MENUOX to confirm.
 - To delete the current number press .

Note

If no detect number is set the prefix number will be added to all pre-dialled numbers.

6.4 Recall time

This setting is useful to access certain network and PABX / switchboard services.

The default C42 recall time is suitable for your country and network operator. It is unlikely that you should need to change this setting unless advised to do so.

- 1. Press MENU/OK, scroll ▼ to SERVICES and press
- 2. Scroll ▼ to **RECALL TIME** and press
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to SHORT, MEDIUM or LONG and press to confirm.

6.5 Dial mode

Your C42 is set to tone dialling. You should only need to change this if connected to an older type of switchboard / PABX which requires pulse dialling.

- 1. Press _____, scroll ▼ to SERVICES and press _____
- 2. Scroll ▼ to **DIAL MODE** and press
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to TONE or PULSE and press to confirm.

6.6 Auto Clock

If you have subscribed to Caller ID Service, the date and time will be set on your base whenever a call is received. This feature can be set to On or Off.

- 1. Press _____, scroll ▼ to **SERVICES** and press _____
- 2. Scroll ▼ to AUTO CLOCK and press
- 3. Scroll ▼ to ON or OFF and press to confirm.

6.7 De-register a handset

Use your base to de-register a handset.

- 1. Press ______ scroll ▼ to SERVICES and press _____
- 2. Scroll ▼ to UNREGISTER and press
- 3. The display shows PIN, using the keypad enter the PIN and press
- 4. Scroll to the handset you want to de-register and press to confirm.

7. Caller ID and the Calls list

Important

To use Caller ID, you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A subscription fee may be payable.

To ensure that the caller's name is displayed, make sure you have stored the full telephone number, including the area code in the phonebook.

If the caller's number is stored in the phonebook, the name assigned to it will be displayed.

If the number is unavailable, **CALLING** and **UNAVAILABLE** will be displayed, and **UNAVAILABLE** will be stored in the calls list.

If the number is withheld, **CALLING** and **WITHHELD** will be displayed, and **WITHHELD** will be stored in the calls list.

If the call is from an international number, the number and **INTERNATIONAL** will be displayed and stored in the call list.

If the call is from the operator, the number and **OPERATOR** will be displayed and the number will be stored to the call list.

If the call is from a payphone, the number and **PAYPHONE** will be displayed and the number will be stored to the call list.

If the call is from a ringback request, the number and **RINGBACK** will be displayed and the number will be stored to the call list.

7.1 Caller ID

If you have subscribed to a Caller ID Service, you will be able to see your caller's number on your base (provided it is not withheld) prior to answering the call. The display can show the first 14 digits of the phone numbers.

7.2 Calls list

The Calls list stores details of up to 20 callers, including the phone number and date and time of the call.

The caller's details are stored in the Calls list whether or not you have answered the call. The list is shared by the base and all handsets registered to the base. When the list is full, and a new call is received, the oldest entry will be deleted automatically.

When a new call is received in the Calls list, **MISSED CALL** will appear on the display in standby mode to alert you. When you have viewed the new call, **MISSED CALL** disappears.

- 1. Press root to open the Calls list.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to scroll through the list.

7.2.1 View the Calls list

- 1. Press 🕜 to open the Calls list.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangle or \triangledown to the entry you want to view.
- 3. Press (MENU/OK , the display shows VIEW press (MENU/OK
- 4. The display shows the date and time of the call.

7.2.2 Dial a number in the Calls list

- 1. Press 🖉 to open the Calls list.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the entry you want to dial.
- 3. Lift the corded handset or press rest to dial the displayed entry.

7.2.3 Copy a number to the phonebook

- 1. Press 🕜 to open the Calls list.
- 2. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to the entry you want to copy.
- 3. Press _____, scroll ▼ to SAVE NUMBER.
- 4. Press (MENU/OK), the display shows ENTER NAME press (MENU/OK
- Enter the name using the keypad, if you make a mistake press b c delete a character or digit.
- 6. Press edit the number if necessary.
- 7. Press MENUJOK, the entry is saved.

Note

See "Entering names" and "Writing tips" on page 23.

7.2.4 Delete an entry

- 2. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to the entry you want to delete.

7.2.5 Delete the entire Calls list

- 1. Press 🕜 to open the Calls list.
- 2. Press _____, scroll ▼ to DELETE ALL.
- 3. Press the display shows **CONFIRM**?
- 4. Press to confirm.

Using your cordless handset

8. Using the phone

8.1 Switch the cordless handset on / off

Press and hold when in standby mode to switch the handset on or off.

8.2 Calls

8.2.1 Make a call

- 1. Press
- 2. When you hear the dial tone, dial the number.

8.2.2 Preparatory dialling

- 1. Dial the number first. If you make a mistake press @ to delete the last digit.
- 2. Press 🖍 to dial.

8.2.3 End a call

1. Press , or place the handset back on the charger.

8.2.4 Receive a call

When you receive a call, the handset rings and $\$ flashes on the display.

1. If the handset is off the charger then press to answer the call, or if the handset is on the charger lift the handset and press to answer the call.

8.3 Adjust the earpiece volume

1. During a call, press \Rightarrow or $\sqrt[6]{}$ to increase or decrease the volume. There are 5 levels to choose from.

8.4 Mute

You can mute your handset so that you can talk to someone nearby without your caller hearing.

- 1. During a call, press The display shows **Mute on** and your caller cannot hear you.
- 2. Press 💽 again to resume your call.

8.5 Intercom

8.5.1 Make an internal call

You can make internal calls between the base and handset, or if you have more than one handset registered to the base, you can make internal calls between two handsets.

- 1. Press Int on the handset.
 - If you have only one cordless handset the base is called automatically,

Handset 1 is displayed on the corded base.

- If you have two handsets registered to the base the second handset is called automatically.
- If more than two handsets are registered to the base, the relevant numbers are displayed, e.g. **Handset 2**.
- 2. Scroll $\stackrel{\textcircled{0}}{\bullet}$ to select the handset you want to call and press $\stackrel{\textcircled{w}}{=}$.

8.5.2 Receive an internal call

When you receive an internal call, the display shows **Handset** and the handset number that is calling you.

1. Press to answer the call.

Note

If during an internal call you receive and an incoming call, you will hear the alert tone on the handset.

Press and then to answer the call.

8.5.3 Transfer a call

You can transfer an external call to the base or another handset registered to the base.

During an external call:

- 1. Press Int on the handset.
 - If you have only one cordless handset the base is called automatically, Handset 1 is displayed for the corded base.
 - If you have two handsets registered to the base the second handset is called automatically.
 - If more than two handsets are registered to the base, the relevant numbers are displayed, e.g.Handset 2.
- 2. Scroll $\overset{\textcircled{0}}{\bullet}$ to select the handset you want to call and press $\overset{\textcircled{0}}{\bullet}$.
- 3. When the internal call is answered, press d to complete the transfer.

Note

Your external call resumes automatically after 60 seconds if there is no answer.

8.5.4 3-way conference call

You can hold a 3-way conference call between 2 internal callers and 1 external caller.

During a call with an external caller:

- Press Int to put the external caller on hold.
- If you have only one cordless handset the base is called automatically, **Handset** 1 is displayed on the corded base.
- If more than two handsets are registered to the base, the relevant numbers are displayed, e.g.Handset 2.

Using the phone

- 2. Scroll $\overset{\textcircled{0}}{\bullet}$ to select the handset you want to call and press $\overset{\textcircled{0}}{\bullet}$.
- When the handset answers, press do connect all three callers and begin the conference call.
- 4. Press no end the call.

Note

Your external call resumes automatically after 60 seconds if there is no answer.

8.6 Hands-free speakerphone

Hands-free lets you talk to your caller without holding the handset. It also enables other people in the room to listen to the conversation over the loudspeaker.

8.6.1 Make a hands-free call

- Dial the number and then press ⁴.

 I icon is displayed and you will hear the call over the handset loudspeaker.
- 2. Press $\overline{\P}$ to switch the call between the earpiece and the loudspeaker.
- 3. Press ito end the call.

Note

During a hands-free call, press a or v to adjust the volume. There are 5 levels to choose from.

8.6.2 Answer a call hands-free

 If the handset is off the charger then press de to answer the call, or if the handset is on the charger lift the handset and press de to answer the call.

8.6.3 Switch to hands-free during a call

During a call, press 🔄 to put the call on the loudspeaker.

To switch hands-free off and return the call to the earpiece, press 🔄 again.

8.7 Redial

The last 10 entries dialled are stored in the redial list.

8.7.1 View or dial an entry

- 1. Press $\stackrel{\textcircled{1}}{\bullet}$ to open the Redial list.
- 2. Scroll $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ or $\stackrel{\textcircled{\bullet}}{\Rightarrow}$ to the entry you want.
- 3. Press to dial the displayed entry or press 🖹 to return to standby.

Note

If the called number exactly matches an entry stored in the phonebook, the name is displayed.

8.7.2 Copy a Redial list number to the phonebook

- 2. Scroll $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ or $\stackrel{\textcircled{0}}{\Rightarrow}$ to the entry you want.

- 6. Edit the number if necessary and press .
- 7. The display shows **Saved!**.
- 8. Press et to return to standby.

Note

See "Entering names" and "Writing tips" on page 35.

8.7.3 Delete an entry

- 1. Press $\overset{\textcircled{1}}{\bullet}$ to open the Redial list.
- 2. Scroll $\stackrel{\bullet}{\rightarrow}$ or $\stackrel{\textcircled{0}}{\rightarrow}$ to the entry you want.
- Press , if the phone number is stored in the phonebook the display shows Delete, if not scroll to Delete and press .
- 4. The display shows **Confirm?**. Press to confirm.
- 5. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

8.7.4 Delete the entire Redial list

- Press ♥ to open the Redial list.
- 2. Press [™], scroll [●] to **Delete all**, press [™].
- 3. The display shows **Confirm**?. Press $\overset{\text{term}}{\propto}$ to confirm.
- 4. Press et to return to standby.

8.8 Lock / unlock the keypad

You can lock the keypad so that it cannot be operated accidentally while carrying it around.

- 1. Press and hold $\textcircled{\bigstar}$ for 2 seconds to lock and unlock the keypad.
- 2. When the keypad is locked the display shows Keys locked.

Note

When the keypad is locked, you can still answer incoming calls. When the call ends, the keypad lock comes on again.

8.9 Find a handset

You can alert a handset user that they are wanted or locate a missing handset.

- 1. Press on the base. All handsets registered to the base will ring.
- 2. To stop the ringing, press a on the base again, or press any button on the cordless handset except int or 🖫

9. Phonebook

You can store up to 50 names and numbers in the cordless handset. Names can be up to 14 characters long and numbers up to 24 digits. The base and handset share the phonebook.

9.1 Store a name and number

If you have subscribed to Caller ID service and wish the name and number to flash alternately on the display instead of just the number, save the full telephone number including the area code to your phonebook.

You can store multiple entries with the same name. However, to prevent unnecessary duplicated entries, you can only store the same number once.

- 1. Press . The display shows **Phonebook**.
- 2. Press x scroll to Add new.
- 3. Press to select. The display shows **Enter name**.
- 4. Using the keypad enter the name and press
- 5. The display shows Enter number.

- 6. The display shows the existing number.
- 7. Edit the number and press
- 8. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

9.4 Delete an entry

- 1. Press $\overset{\text{ser}}{\sim}$, the display shows **Phonebook**.
- 2. Press $\overset{\text{\tiny MND}}{\smile}$, scroll $\overset{\text{\tiny MND}}{\clubsuit}$ to **Delete** and press $\overset{\text{\tiny MND}}{\smile}$.
- Scroll or to the entry you want to delete, or search alphabetically and press ^m/_m.
- 4. The display shows Confirm?.
- 5. Press to confirm.
- 6. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

9.5 Delete all entries

- 1. Press , the display shows **Phonebook**.
- 2. Press [™], scroll [●] to **Delete all**.
- 3. Press , the display shows **Confirm**?.
- 4. Press do confirm.
- 5. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

10. Phone setup

10.1 Sounds

10.1.1 Ring volume

You can adjust the ring volume on your handset. Choose from 5 volume levels or off.

- 1. Press $\overset{\text{MEM}}{\frown}$, scroll $\overset{\text{MEM}}{\bigtriangledown}$ to **Phone setup** and press $\overset{\text{MEM}}{\frown}$.
- 2. The display shows **Sounds** press
- 3. The display shows **Ring volume**, press
- 4. Scroll $\stackrel{\bullet}{\sim}$ or $\stackrel{\textcircled{}{}}{}$ to select the volume (1 5 or Off) and press $\stackrel{\textcircled{}{}}{}$ to confirm.

On the cordless handset you can set different ringer melodies for your external calls. Choose from 10 different ringer melodies.

You will hear a sample ring as you scroll to each ring melody.

- 5. Press 🖹 to return to standby.

10.1.4 Docking tone

- 4. Scroll $\stackrel{\bullet}{\rightarrow}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\clubsuit}$ to select **On** or **Off** and press $\stackrel{\text{mod}}{\longrightarrow}$ to confirm.
- 5. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

Phone setup

10.1.5 Battery tone

- 1. Press [™], scroll [●] to **Phone setup** and press [™].
- 2. The display shows **Sounds** press
- 3. Scroll ♥ to Battery tone and press .
- 4. Scroll \clubsuit or \clubsuit to select **On** or **Off** and press \clubsuit to confirm.
- 5. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

10.2 ECO+ mode

- 1. Press $\overset{\text{max}}{\swarrow}$, scroll $\overset{\text{scroll}}{\checkmark}$ to **Phone setup** and press $\overset{\text{max}}{\backsim}$.
- 2. Scroll \bigvee to **ECO+ mode** and press
- 3. Scroll $\stackrel{\bullet}{\Rightarrow}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\clubsuit}$ to select **On** or **Off** and press $\stackrel{\text{mag}}{=}$ to confirm.
- 4. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

10.3 Handset name

If you are using more than one cordless handset with your C42 base, you can set a personalized name for each handset to easily distinguish between them.

A name can be up to 12 characters long.

- Press [™], scroll [●] to Phone setup and press [™].
- 2. Scroll to **Phone name** and press
- 3. The display shows the current name.
- 4. Edit the name and press $\overset{\text{ww}}{\simeq}$ to confirm.
- 5. Press et to return to standby.

Note

Press and hold $\frac{1}{2}$ to switch between the handset display showing the handset name and number or the date and time.

10.4 Set the date and time

If you have subscribed to Caller ID Service, the date and time will be set on all your handsets whenever a call is received. You can also manually set the date and time on the individual handsets.

- 1. Press $\overset{\text{ww}}{\swarrow}$ scroll $\overset{\text{w}}{\clubsuit}$ to **Phone setup** and press $\overset{\text{ww}}{\checkmark}$.
- 2. Scroll ♥ to Date & time. Press .
- 3. Using the keypad enter the date (e.g. 04-12-2019 for 4th of December 2019) and press $\frac{1}{100}$ to confirm.
- 4. Enter the time in 24 hour format (e.g. 18-30 for 6:30pm) and press

Note

Only the last two digits of the year are adjustable.

10.5 Language

You can change the display language for your handset, there are 9 to choose from. .

- 1. Press $\overset{\text{www}}{\checkmark}$, scroll $\overset{\text{www}}{\clubsuit}$ to **Phone setup** and press $\overset{\text{www}}{\checkmark}$.
- 3. Scroll \oint_{∞} or \bigvee_{∞} to select the language you require and press $\overset{\text{min}}{\simeq}$ to confirm.
- 4. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

11. Services

11.1 Call list type

You can set the Call list to show All calls or Missed calls only. If All calls is selected, press & key in idle and you can view all calls lists. If Missed calls is selected, press key in idle and you can view missed call only.

- 1. Press $\overset{\text{res}}{\frown}$, scroll $\overset{\text{scroll}}{\bullet}$ to **Services** and press $\overset{\text{res}}{\frown}$.
- 2. The display shows **Call list type**, press
- 3. Scroll $\stackrel{\bullet}{\sim}$ or $\stackrel{\textcircled{0}}{=}$ to the call list you require, **All calls** or **Missed calls**.
- 4. Press to confirm.
- 5. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

11.2 Conference

When the feature is set to Auto, if handset 1 is on line with an external caller, handset 2 can seize the line and immediately join the call with handset 1 and the external caller.

- Press [™]_∞, scroll [™] to Services and press [™]_∞.
- 2. Scroll \clubsuit to **Conference** and press \clubsuit .
- 3. Scroll $\stackrel{\bullet}{\sim}$ or $\stackrel{\bullet}{\bullet}$ to **Off** or **Auto** and press $\stackrel{\text{wid}}{\sim}$ to confirm.
- 4. Press et to return to standby.

11.3 Auto prefix

This feature checks and formats a pre-dialled outgoing number before it is dialled out.

Set detect digit and prefix number

You can set a detect number that can be up to 5 digits, once this number has been set the phone will check the first few digits of the any pre-dialled number and if they match the detect number will be replaced them with the prefix number.

You can also define a prefix number (maximum of 10 digits) to be added to the beginning of any pre-dialled number.

- 1. Press $\overset{\text{min}}{\swarrow}$, scroll $\overset{\text{min}}{\clubsuit}$ to **Services** and press $\overset{\text{min}}{\backsim}$.
- 3. The display shows **Detect digit** press
- Using the keypad enter the number and press .
 To delete the current number press .
- 5. Press $\frac{1}{2}$, the display shows **Prefix**.
- Using the keypad enter the number and press [™]/_■ to confirm. To delete the current number press [™]/_■.

7. Press 🖻 to return to standby.

Note

If no detect number is set the prefix number will be added to all pre-dialled numbers.

11.4 Recall time

This setting is useful to access certain network and PABX / switchboard services.

The default C42 recall time is suitable for your country and network operator. It is unlikely that you should need to change this setting unless advised to do so.

- Press [™]/_∞, scroll [●] to Services and press [™]/_∞.
- 2. Scroll to **Recall time** and press

Your C42 is set to tone dialling. You should only need to change this if connected to an older type of switchboard / PABX which requires pulse dialling.

- 2. Scroll $\stackrel{\textcircled{1}}{\bullet}$ to **Dial mode** and press
- 3. Scroll 🎤 or 💐 to **Tone** or **Pulse** and press 🛒 to confirm.
- 4. Press et to return to standby.

11.6 Auto clock

If you have subscribed to Caller ID Service, the date and time will be set on all your handsets whenever a call is received. This feature can be set to On or Off.

- Press [™], scroll [●] to Services and press [™].
- 2. Scroll \clubsuit to **Auto clock** and press
- 3. Scroll to **On** or **Off** and press to confirm.

11.7 Register a handset

You can register up to 4 handsets to your C42 base to extend your phone system without having to install extension sockets for each new phone.

If you have purchased a C42 multiple pack, all additional handsets come preregistered to the base.

If you have purchased an additional handset separately, you must register it to your C42 base before it can be used.

Note

Handset batteries must be fully charged before you start to register. Hold your handset close to the base during the registration process. Handsets that were supplied with your C42 base are already pre-registered.

On the base:

 Press and hold for 5 seconds until you hear a beep. The base will remain in registration mode for 90 seconds.

On the handset:

- If the handset is not register to a base press and then enter the 4 digit PIN code (default = 0000) and press and press.
- If the handset is already register to a base press ^m/₂, scroll ^b to Services and press ^m/₂.
- 3. Scroll \clubsuit to **Register** and press
- 4. The display will ask for the PIN to be entered. Enter the 4 digit PIN code (default = 0000) and press (). You will hear a beep if the registration is successful. The handset is automatically assigned an available handset number. Use this number when making internal calls.

11.8 De-register a handset

Use your base to de-register a handset.

- 1. Press $\overset{\text{sour}}{\sim}$, scroll $\overset{\text{sources}}{\bullet}$ to **Services** and press $\overset{\text{sources}}{\sim}$.
- 2. Scroll to **Unregister** and press

You can restore your C42 to its default (original) settings. All the handsets that are registered to the base will be retained.

Resetting your phone to its default settings will delete all entries in the Redial list and Calls list. All handset and base settings will also be reset.

12. Caller ID and the Calls list

Important

To use Caller ID, you must first subscribe to the service from your network provider. A subscription fee may be payable.

To ensure that the caller's name is displayed, make sure you have stored the full telephone number, including the area code in the phonebook.

If the caller's number is stored in the phonebook, the name assigned to it will be displayed.

If the number is unavailable, **Calling** and **Unavailable** will be displayed, and **Unavailable** will be stored in the calls list.

If the number is withheld, **Calling** and **Withheld** will be displayed, and **Withheld** will be stored in the calls list.

If the call is from an international number, the number and **International** will be displayed and stored in the call list.

If the call is from the operator, the number and **Operator** will be displayed and the number will be stored to the call list.

If the call is from a payphone, the number and **Payphone** will be displayed and the number will be stored to the call list.

If the call is from a ringback request, the number and **Ringback** will be displayed and the number will be stored to the call list.

12.1 Caller ID

If you have subscribed to a Caller ID Service, you will be able to see your caller's number on your handset (provided it is not withheld) prior to answering the call. If the caller's number is 14 digits, the display will show all the digits of the number. If the number is longer than 14 digits, the display will show the last 14 digits and **b** on the handset display.

If your caller's name and number are stored in the phonebook and a number match is found, the caller's name and number will flash alternately on the display.

12.2 Calls list

The Calls list stores details of up to 20 callers, including the phone number and date and time of the call.

The caller's details are stored in the Calls list whether or not you have answered the call. The list is shared by the base and all handsets registered to the base. When the list is full, and a new call is received, the oldest entry will be deleted automatically.

When a new call is received in the Calls list, **Missed call** will appear on the display in standby mode to alert you. When you have viewed the new call, **Missed call** disappears.

12.2.1 View the Calls list

- 1. Press to open the Calls list. If there are no calls in the list, the display shows List empty.
- 2. Press $\stackrel{\bigstar}{P}$ or $\stackrel{\textcircled{\$}}{P}$ to scroll through the list.

- If the caller's number exactly matches an entry stored in the phonebook, the display will show the name. Keep pressing into see the call details.
- If the telephone number is longer than 14 digits, ▶ is displayed. Press see the remaining digits.
