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1. Getting started

Location

Important

Do not place your phone in the bathroom or other humid areas.

Signal strength

The $\textbf{Y}_{\textbf{ull}}$ icon on your display indicates that you have a strong signal. When the signal strength reduces the number of bars reduces.

If you are on a call, the line will hang up if the base loses signal.

Underside of the base



- A SIM bracket
- B Microphone
- C Battery compartment
- D SIM card slot

E Base curly cord socket

Plug the curly cord with the longer straight section into the base and hook the cord into the cord track.

F Battery plug socket

Inserting the SIM

- Slide the SIM card bracket down towards the base of the SIM card slot.
- (2) With your finger lift the bracket.

- Place the SIM card in the SIM card slot.
- (4) Lower the SIM card bracket down over the SIM.
- (5) Slide the SIM card bracket up to lock the SIM card into place.

Note

Make sure the phone is turned off and not connected to the power when you insert or remove the SIM card. Do not touch the metal plate area of the SIM card and keep away from electromagnetic fields.









Installing the battery

Once the SIM card is installed, plug the battery pack connector into the socket inside the compartment and press down firmly.

To ensure proper battery installation, the connector is keyed and can be inserted only one way.

Place the battery pack in the large compartment (C).

(1) Push the battery cover clips towards the cover and lift the cover off

> Place the battery into the battery compartment.













Clip the battery cover back into (4)place.

Connecting the handset and connecting the base to a computer / charging the battery



- 1. Plug the curly cord with the shorter straight section into the handset and the longer straight section into the socket marked ${\bf G}$ on the base.
- 2. Plug the USB cable into the socket marked \clubsuit on the side of the base.
- Insert the other end into either an AC adaptor and connect to the mains power socket or an active computer USB port.
- The battery symbol on the display will scroll while charging and in will be displayed once the battery is fully charged.

Note

You do not need to have the battery installed for the phone to work. If the battery is not installed plug the base into a power source, the () icon will be displayed instead of the battery symbol.

Battery low warning

When the battery has at 15% charge the base will emit a battery low warning tone, when it reaches 4% charge it will beep again. If the battery charge is less than 1%, the base will prompt **Phone will shut down after 15s** and then will count down and then shut down. You will need to recharge the battery or plug the phone into a power source before you can use it again.

Battery performance

In ideal conditions, a fully charged battery should give up to 5 hours talk time or up to 32 hours standby time on a single charge.¹

Note that a new battery does not reach the full capacity until it has been put to normal use for several days.

Running the battery right down at least once a month will help it last as long as possible.

The charge capacity of the rechargeable battery will reduce with time as it wears out, giving less talk / standby time. Eventually it will need to be replaced.

After charging your phone for the first time, subsequent charging time is about 6-8 hours a day. The battery and phone may become warm during charging. This is normal.

¹All talk and standby times are approximate and depend on features selected and usage pattern.

Date and time

You can set the date and time for your phone. When setting the date and time check whether the time format setting is 12 or 24-hours. The default is 24-hours. To change the format, see "Set the time and date format" on page 37. If the automatic date & time is set to on you can not set the date and time for the phone manually.

Set the date

If the automatic date & time is set to off you can set the date and time for the phone manually.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Settings and press OK.
- Scroll ▼ to Date & time and press OK.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to Set date and press OK.
- Enter the date using the keypad e.g. 2024/12/10 for 10 December 2024 and press OK.
- 5. Press (1) to return to standby.

Set the time

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Settings and press OK.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to Date & time and press OK.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to Set time and press OK.
- 4. If the time format is set to 24-hours, enter the time using the keypad, e.g. 14:45 for 02:45pm.

If the time format is set to 12-hours, scroll \blacktriangle or \blacktriangledown to select AM or PM and then enter the time using the keypad e.g. 02:45 for 02:45pm and press OK.

5. Press (1) to return to standby.

Overview of your phone



A. Antenna

B. Display

For display icons, see "Display" on page 8.

C. Scroll up / Calendar

Scroll up through lists and settings. Press to view the calendar. Press to move the cursor up.

D. Scroll left / Settings

Press to move the cursor to the left. Press to enter the settings menu.

E. Menu / OK

Enter the main menu. Select the option displayed on screen. Confirm a menu option.

F. Scroll down / Speed dial Scroll down through lists and settings. Press to go to the speed dial menu.

Press to move the cursor down.

G. *

Press to dial a *. Keep pressing to dial +, p or w.

н. ок

Press this key to select the lower left corner function on the screen.

I. Contacts / Clear / Back

Enter the contacts list menu. Delete characters on screen when entering names and numbers. Go back to the previous menu, **Back** is displayed on the screen.

J. Scroll right / Calculator

Press to move the cursor to the right. Press to enter calculator mode.

K. Charging light

L. Power on/off / Exit

Press and hold for 3 seconds to switch the phone off or on. When in the menu press to return to standby.

M. Redial list / Send call

Press to enter the redial list. Once a telephone number is pre-dialled press to dial.

N. Hands-free

Press to make, answer or end a hands-free call. Press to switch hands-free on during a call.

o.

Press to dial a #. In editing mode, press repeatedly to scroll through the character input methods (Abc, abc, ABC or 123).

P. Space

In editing mode, press to insert a space in text / number editing.

Note

No SIM will be displayed when there is no SIM card inserted, if there is a SIM card inserted, the name of network provider will be displayed.

The icons will always align to the left and as higher priority icons appear the other icons will shift to the right. Some icons replace others along the top of the display depending on which function is activated. The battery and signal icons are fixed in place.

Getting to know your phone

Navigating the menus

Your phone menu has 7 sub-menus. Each sub-menu contains options that allow you to use the contacts list, change the ring tone, etc. You can use menus and sub-menus by following the below.

Scrolling through menus

- From the standby screen, press Menu or <u>w</u>. The main menu is opened.
- 2. Use the \blacktriangle / \blacktriangledown / \blacklozenge / \blacklozenge keys to scroll through the menu.
- Left softkey or soft press to action the corresponding word prompt shown in the lower left corner of the display. Right softkey - press to action the corresponding word prompt in the lower right corner of the display.
- 4. Press (1) to return to standby.

Shortcut keys

You can use a shortcut key to go to the pre-set option directly without scrolling through lists.

- From the standby screen, press ▲ / ▼ / ◀ / ▶ to get to the pre-set shortcuts.
 - to enter the calendar menu
 - to enter the speed dial menu
 - to enter the settings menu
 - to enter the calculator menu

Note

¹If no contacts are stored **No contacts** is displayed, press **Option** and then **OK** to add a contact. If contacts are stored the first contact is highlighted, either press **Option** and scroll ▼ to **New** and press **OK** to add a contact. Or scroll ▼ to the required contact and press **Option**.

²When a SIM card is installed the screen will display the current network.

³These features are network dependent.

3. Using the phone

Note

Your phone will automatically time the duration of all external calls, the call timer will display on the screen. When the call ends, the total duration of your talk time is shown for 1 second.

3.1 Inserting the SIM

Make sure the phone is turned off (see below) and not connected to the power when you insert or remove the SIM card. Do not touch the metal plate area of the SIM card and keep away from electromagnetic fields.

3.2 Switch the handset off

- 1. Press and hold ^(a) for 3 seconds.
- 2. Power off is highlighted, press OK or or.
- 3. The display shows, Your phone will shut down, press OK or .
- 4. Press and hold ^(a) for 3 seconds to turn the phone back on.
- 5. Once turned on the phone will search for the network. If your SIM is locked you will be prompted to insert you PIN.
- 6. After the phone is registered to the network, the signal will be displayed at the top left corner of the screen. The phone is now in standby and you can make or answer a call. Your phone remains in a searching state if it fails to find the available network.

3.3 Calls

3.3.1 Make a call

- 1. Lift the handset or press < to make a hands-free call.

3.3.2 Preparatory dialling

- Dial the number first. If you make a mistake press Delete to delete the last digit.
- 2. Lift the handset or press \checkmark or @ to dial.

3.3.3 Dial using speed dial keys

1. Press and hold the relevant keypad number to dial the pre-stored number directly.

Note

Key 1 will automatically be assigned with the voicemail number for your network provider.

Make sure the speed dial memory is set to on, see "Turn the speed dial memory on/off" on page 41.

To assign a speed dial number, see "Store a speed dial memory number" on page 42.

3.3.4 End a call

Either press ${\rm Hang}~{\rm up},$ place the handset back on the base or press (4) to end a hands-free call.

Note

If before the line connects, you decide that you want to end the call, replace the handset on the base or press **Hang up**. To end a hands-free call press $\widehat{\textcircled{e}}$ or press **Hang up**.

3.3.5 Receive a call

When you receive an external call, the phone rings, **Incoming call** and the phone number (or name if stored in the contacts list) is displayed.

- 1. Lift the handset or press **Answer** / 🕸 to answer the call hands-free.
- If you don't want to answer the call, press Hang up and the caller will be redirected.

3.4 Adjust the earpiece or hands-free volume

 During a call, press ► to increase and ◄ to decrease the volume level. There are 6 levels to choose from.

3.5 Mute

- 1. During a call press **Options**, **Mute** is highlighted, press **OK**.
- 2. To turn mute off, press Options, Unmute is highlighted, press OK.

3.6 Hold

You can place your caller on hold if your network operator provides the service.

- 1. During a call press **Options**, scroll ▼ to **Hold** and press **OK**.
- 2. To turn hold off, press **Options**, scroll ▼ to **Resume** and press **OK**.

3.7 Add call

Put an external caller on hold to make a second external call. You can then switch between both callers or hold a 3-way conference call.

- During your call, press Options, scroll ▼ to Add call. The first call is put on hold.
- 4. Enter the second number.
- 5. Press 🕜 or Option and Call to dial.

4. Contacts

The phones contacts list has a capacity of up to 2000 contacts in the base and you can also store additional contacts on the SIM (the number is dependent on the SIM capacity).

Numbers can be up to 40 digits long and names can be up to 14 characters long. Contacts are stored in alphabetical order.

4.1 Entering names and writing tips

Use the alphanumeric keypad to enter names in the contacts list. For instance to enter the name Tom.

T Press (8 11/2) once

o Press 💷 three times

m Press 6.... once

To enter a space press O_.

Press Delete to delete a character or press and hold Delete to delete all characters.

When entering a name into the contacts list you can scroll through the character input methods (Abc, abc, ABC or 123) by pressing the button repeatedly.

4.2 Storing contacts

The phone can be set so it stores contacts either to the SIM card or the phone and you can copy or move individual contacts or the whole contacts list from the SIM card to the phone or from the phone to the SIM card.

4.2.1 Store contacts

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- 2. Press Option and scroll ▼ to New and press OK.
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select Phone or SIM Card and press OK.
- 4. Enter the name using the keypad.
- 5. Scroll ▼ and enter the number, press Option.
- 6. Save is highlighted, press OK to store.
- 7. Press (a) to return to standby.

Note

Cancel storing a contact by pressing (a) at any time during the process.

4.2.2 Search and contact

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- 2. Press Option, Search is highlighted, press OK.
- 3. Enter the first characters(s) of the name or the first digits of the number to search.
- Scroll ▼ to the exact entry.
- 5. Press (a) to return to standby.

4.2.3 Copy individual contacts

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the contact you want to copy and press Option.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to Detail and press OK.
- 4. Press **Option**, scroll ▼ to **Copy** and press **OK**.
- 5. The display shows Copy this contact?, press OK to copy.
- 6. Press (1) to return to standby.

4.2.4 Copy all contacts

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- Press Option, scroll ▼ to Batch copy and press OK.
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select Copy to SIM or Copy to phone and press OK.
- The contacts are listed. Press Option and scroll ▼ to Select all.
- 5. Press OK, then Option and scroll ▼ to Copy and press OK to copy all contacts.
- 6. Press (a) to return to standby.

Note

When moving or copying contacts the phone will copy all contacts even if that contact is already saved.

4.3 View contact details

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the contact you want to view and press Option.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to Detail and press OK.
- 1. The name and the number will be displayed.
- 2. Press (1) to return to standby.

4.4 Edit a contact

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the contact you want to edit and press Option.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to Edit and press OK.
- 4. Edit the name. Press **Delete** to delete characters.
- 5. Scroll ▼ and edit the number. Press Option and then OK to confirm.
- 6. Press (1) to return to standby.

4.5 Dial contacts

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the contact you want to dial and press Option. Scroll ▼ to Call and press OK to dial the contact.

4.6 Delete a contact

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- 2. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the contact you want to view and press Option.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to Detail and press OK.
- 4. Press **Option**, scroll ▼ to **Delete** and press **OK**.
- 5. Display shows Delete this contact?. Press OK to delete or Cancel to cancel.
- 6. Press (a) to return to standby.

4.7 Delete all contacts

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- 2. Press **Option**, scroll ▼ to **Batch delete** and press **OK**.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select Delete SIM contacts or Delete phone contacts and press OK.
- 4. The contacts are listed. Press **Option** and scroll ▼ to **Select all**.
- 5. Press OK, then Option and scroll ▼ to Delete and press OK.
- 6. Display shows Delete?. Press OK to delete or Back to cancel.
- 7. Press (a) to return to standby.

4.8 Memory status

You can check how much contacts list memory you have on your phone or on the SIM.

- 1. Press Contacts. The first contact is highlighted. Press Option.
- Scroll ▲ to Storage available and press OK.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to SIM available capacity or Phone available capacity and press OK.
- The number of contacts stored and available space is displayed on the screen.

4.9 Send text message to a contact

- 1. Press Contact. The first contact is highlighted.
- Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the contact you want to send a message to and press Options. Scroll ▼ to Send message and press OK.
- 3. Using the keypad write your message and press Options.
- 4. Send is highlighted.
- 5. Press OK, Options and OK to send.

Note

For other text messaging options, see "Text messaging" on page 28.

5. Call log

You can view or delete your recent calls and see the duration of those calls in the phones call log menu, there are 3 call logs, **Missed call, Received calls** and **Outgoing**. The number of entries stored is dependent on the memory available in the base.

5.1 Call a number in the call log

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- Press OK to select Missed call or ▼ to Received calls or Outgoing and press OK.
- 3. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to the number you want to call and press Option.
- 4. Call is highlighted, press OK to call.

5.2 Send a message

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- 2. Press OK to select Missed call or scroll ▼ to Received calls or Outgoing and press OK.
- 3. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to the contact you want to send a message to and press Option.
- Scroll ▼ to Send messages and press OK.
- 5. Using the keypad write your message and press Options. Send is highlighted.
- 6. Press OK, Option and OK to send.

Note

For other text messaging options, see "Text messaging" on page 28.

5.3 Delete an entry

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- 2. Press OK to select Missed call or scroll ▼ to Received calls or Outgoing and press OK.
- 3. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to the entry you want to delete and press Option.
- Scroll ▼ to Delete and press OK.
- 5. The display shows Delete?.
- 6. Press OK to delete or Back to cancel.
- 7. Press (1) to return to standby.

5.4 Delete a call log

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- 2. Press OK to select Missed call or scroll ▼ to Received calls or Outgoing and press OK.
- 3. Press **Option** and scroll ▼ to **Clear all callog** and press **OK**.
- 4. The display shows Delete?.
- 5. Press OK to delete or Back to cancel.
- 6. Press (a) to return to standby.

5.5 Delete all call logs

- Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- Scroll ▼ to Clear all callog and press OK.
- 3. The display shows Clear all callog?.
- 4. Press **OK** to delete or **Back** to cancel.
- 5. Press (a) to return to standby.

5.6 Add a number to the contacts list

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- Press OK to select Missed call or scroll ▼ to Received calls or Outgoing and press OK.
- 3. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to the contact you want to add and press Option.
- Scroll ▲ to Add to contacts and press OK.
- 5. Scroll ▲ or ▼ to select Phone or SIM Card and press OK.
- 6. Enter the name using the keypad and press **Option**.
- 7. Save is highlighted, press OK to store.
- 8. Press 🖲 to return to standby.

5.7 View a call log entry

- 9. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- 10. Press OK to select Missed call or scroll ▼ to Received calls or Outgoing and press OK.
- 11. Scroll \blacktriangle or \blacksquare to the entry you want to view and press Option.
- 12. Scroll ▼ to Detail and press OK.
- 13. The name is displayed if the number is stored in the contacts list, scroll for ▼ for the number, date, time and duration of the call. If the number is not stored, the number will be displayed, scroll ▼ for date, time and duration of the call.

5.8 Call duration

You can view the call duration of your last call or the total call duration of your and Received calls (In call:) and the total call duration of all Received calls and Outgoing calls (All call:).

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- 2. Scroll ▲ to Call duration and press OK.
- 3. Last call: is displayed and the duration of that call, scroll ▼ to view the duration of In call: and All call: information.
- 4. The time will be displayed.
- 5. Press () to return to standby.

5.9 Reset the call duration

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to Call log and press OK.
- Scroll A to Call duration and press OK.
- 3. Press Clear to reset or Back to cancel.
- 4. Press (1) to return to standby.

6. Text messaging

Your phone can send and receive text messages from participating mobile networks and compatible landline telephones.

Note

You can also write a text message while on a call. Press **Options** and scroll \checkmark to **Send message** and press **OK**. Write your message and press **Options** and **OK**, the name or number of the current caller will be displayed, press **Options** and **OK** to send.

6.1 Write a message

If you are writing a text and you receive a call, the text will be displayed again when the call is disconnected.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to SMS and press OK.
- 2. Write message is highlighted, press OK.
- 3. Use the keypad to enter your message.
- Press Options and scroll ▲ or ▼ to:

6.2 Message boxes

Messages can be stored in different boxes, these include Inbox, Outbox Draftbox, and Sentbox.

- 1. Press Menu, scroll ▼ to SMS and press OK.
- 2. Scroll ▼ to the message box you want and press OK.
- 3. Scroll ▼ to the message you want and press **Option**, **View** is highlighted press **OK**.
- The sender, date and SMS content are displayed. Press Option and scroll ▼ to the option you require, as listed below.
